SUBJECT: Trash Disposal and Recycling

1. References, USAREUR Regulation 200-1, 9 December 1993, 414th BSB Housing Residents Guide, 414th BSB Separate or Recycle Trash (SORT) Guidance, Final Governing Standards (FGS), January 2003, and Supplement 1 to AR 420-49, 12 August 2003.

2. The purpose of this policy letter is to establish procedures for the proper separation of trash with the objective to reduce trash disposal costs to meet the 40% recycling goal by 2005 as required by USAREUR/IMA.

3. Segregation of trash is mandatory as outlined by USAREUR/IMA policy, under the "Separate or Recycle Trash" (SORT) Program.

a. The 414th BSB SORT guidance contains all information needed to correctly sort and dispose of trash and hazardous household waste. Copies are distributed to all government housing residents and additional copies can be obtained through the DPW Environmental Management Office (322-8079) or the DPW NCOIC (322-8950).

b. Trash and recyclables must be placed inside the appropriate containers. Random checks of our recycling and trash containers are conducted to ensure compliance with the program.

c. Families residing on the economy will segregate trash in accordance with the procedures specified in their local community. Assistance may be obtained from the Housing Office (322-8013) or the DPW Operations and Maintenance Division (322-9129).

d. Bulk trash items (i.e. furniture, TV's, etc.) must be transported to the recycling centers of the respective housing area (locations are indicated in the Housing Residents Guide).

SUBJECT: Procedures for the Separate or Recycle Trash (SORT)
Program

e. Bulk trash items will be picked-up separately from the regular household trash.

f. In housing areas with Individual Refuse Containers (IRCs), residents will move the IRCs to the respective collection points for their building on their designated pick up dates. IRCs not moved to the collection points will not get emptied. After IRCs have been emptied, residents will move them back into the trash lockers.

g. Trash will not be placed in bags on the curbs or next to the trash lockers.

h. Violations of this policy could result in adverse actions or loss of government housing privileges.
